The Roundtable

EPCH organised a collaborative roundtable meeting in Kohima with Investment & Development Authority Nagaland, Govt. of Nagaland (IDAN) where EPCH COA members had an interaction and exchange of ideas for collaboration in advancing the handicrafts sector. This strategic collaboration is a pivotal initiative aimed at elevating sustainable handicraft exports from Nagaland. Collaborative endeavors were initiated, subsequent delegation meetings with key officials were conducted and prospects and milestones resulting from the partnership were anticipated.

Boom Bazar

On invitation, the EPCH delegation visited the Bloom Bazar that is organised by IDAN at the historic site "The Heritage" old DC Bungalow in the capital of Kohima, with an objective to promote the flower industry and support the state floriculture entrepreneurs. 45 stalls of different varieties of flowers and foliage including activities like fashion show, music, art, food, jewellery, fashion and toys are on display by different participants. The event was also participated by 15 government departments, particularly Agri and allied sectors such as horticulture, agriculture, industries & commerce, Nagaland Bamboo Mission, Honey Mission and alike.

Mr. Dileep Baid, Chairman, EPCH addressed the gathering at the Boom Bazar and said that Nagaland is sitting on a goldmine with natural resource materials and is among the few states in India with these



resources. Bamboo is described as Green Gold and Nagaland additionally has lots of other sustainable natural materials derived from banana, pineapple, etc. He further informed that products from Nagaland have premium takers from all over the world. He also said that EPCH, through its programs, will work together with Nagaland Government on design and technology to make the products relevant and contemporary. He also informed that EPCH has conducted a study on "Bamboo Opportunity - Nagaland" through Ernst & Young, a copy of the same was presented to the Chairman, IDAN.

The discussions delved into specific strategies to unlock opportunities within the handicrafts sector, with an emphasis on nurturing local talent, enhancing designs, developing skills, integrating technology, and formulating effective marketing strategies. Interactive sessions during these delegation meetings provided a comprehensive understanding of the challenges faced by artisans and entrepreneurs in Nagaland. The EPCH COA members also visited the handloom and handicraft cluster at Dimapur, coordinated by Ms. Jesmina Zeliang, COA Member and Convenor, North East Region, EPCH.

Team EPCH received a warm welcome during the two day visit to Dimapur and Kohima underlining the fruitful partnership with IDAN that will be a milestone for taking measures in preparing more entrepreneurs & promoting exports of sustainable handicrafts from Nagaland. The outlined initiatives, encompassing talent development, design enhancement, skill empowerment, technological integration and strategic marketing, are poised to usher in a paradigm shift in the Nagaland handicrafts sector. ■
