

## Hon'ble Minister for Parliamentary Affairs, Law and Justice, Government of Rajasthan launches 'Speakers' Platform' for Principals of Govt. Schools, visits Trade Facilitation Centre (TFC), Jodhpur



On 17th April 2026, Hon'ble Minister for Parliamentary Affairs, Law and Justice, Government of Rajasthan, Shri Jogaram Patel, visited and inspected the Trade Facilitation Centre (TFC), Jodhpur. EPCH's Jodhpur representative briefed him on ongoing export-oriented workshops and seminars, being held from time to time at the centre. On behalf of EPCH, Mr. Nirmal Bhandari, COA Member, EPCH, a formal request was submitted for the allocation of adjoining land to expand the facility. The Hon'ble Minister assured full support for the proposed expansion.

Earlier in the day, a two-day session and the launch of a Speakers' Platform for principals of government and private schools from Blocks Luni, Dhawa, and Keru were inaugurated under the joint auspices of the Education Department, Government of Rajasthan

and EPCH. The Minister was the Chief Guest and the occasion was also graced by Shri Mukesh Dhadich, State Vice President, BJP; former *Jila Pramukh* Shri Punaram Choudhary; and Shri Gordhan Ram, Sarpanch, Boranada.

During the session, Shri Jogaram Patel interacted with principals and officials from 136 schools, reviewed activities conducted over the past year, assessed students' academic performance, and discussed key challenges along with possible solutions. He appreciated EPCH's initiatives, particularly acknowledging the Handicrafts Expo held in Jodhpur in January 2026, and expressed gratitude for the Council's support in organising the event. The programme saw the participation of over 250 attendees, making it a highly engaging and impactful event. ■
