EPCH set up a Special Display Area of Indian handicrafts in an area of 204 sq. mtrs at this show with 32 crafts persons from the North Eastern Region and skilled SC community with an objective to to provide them with a direct market opportunity. Assortments on display included terracotta lines, cane & bamboo products, dry flowers, home furnishing, wooden wares, home decoratives, hand worked sarees, tribal textiles & jewellery, crystal glass decorative crafts, hand block printed goods, embroidery and crochet crafts, leather goods, metal goods, applique crafts, handcrafted shawls
