EPCH set up the India Pavilion that came up vibrantly with a variety of Indian crafts at the 24th edition of AF-L' Artigiano in Fiera, Milan, Italy, an important annual event to promote handcrafted products from various parts of the world to Italy and other European markets. This edition featured more than 3200 exhibitors from 110 countries at the RHO Fiera Exhibition Centre, Milan.

Italy has been a traditional market for Indian handicrafts. Indian handcrafted products were the main attraction in this 9 day retail exhibition displaying metals, wood and



textiles with products ranging from utilities items, furnishing and fabrics, fabrics for dresses and garments, costume jewellery, furniture and fixtures, accessories, fashion made-ups and fashion accessories, decoratives, gifts, paintings, embroidered products for daily use, etc.

This year around 180 Indian companies participated in the fair. The speciality of AF- L' Artigiano in Fiera is that sales across the counter are permitted, besides booking of orders for long term business.

EPCH participants numbered 15 member exporters and 5 National awardee Master crafts persons deputed by the O/o DC (Handicrafts). Shri Tulsiram from MP showcased artistic hand weaving (Chanderi sarees); Shri Ashish Malakar from West Bengal showcased sholapith crafts; Shri Yatendra Kumar from New Delhi showcased crystal glass crafts; Shri Panchu Ram Sagar from Chhattisgarh showcased dhokra casting crafts; and Shri Suresh Chandra Das from Tripura demonsted cane & bamboo craft skills through live demonstration at the fair. The Council had also set up the publicity booth for promotion of forthcoming shows, i.e. IHGF Delhi Fair-Spring 2020 and IFJAS 2020.
